Jeff Comstock in attendance

- ✓ Cook stated he had a meeting with BLM concerning sage grouse. He stated he was disappointed in the meeting and felt they didn't have a part in the discussion.
- ✓ Beck stated there was a press conference at CMU in regards to Anvil Points. Cory Gardner Chaired the meeting.
- ✓ Beck mentioned the aviation dilemma concerning the 1500 hour change.
- ✓ Beck brought up the turkey vulture issue to Senator Gardner.

- ✓ Cook stated as of Friday April 6th, the County had still not received money for Anvil Points.
- ✓ Bower stated her and Nottingham are here to request funds to get new windows for the Brown's Park school. Bower gave a brief update of what had been happening in Brown's Park. Bower stated since they have taken control of it they have had the inside and outside painted, both bathrooms have had windows replaced as well as a toilet, there are new doors and steps into the building and the floor has also been refinished. General Business & Administrative Items:

Siedschlaw discussed two personnel requisitions for the Fairgrounds/Cemetery temporary summer help that will go through Flint Personnel. Siedschlaw stated these are budgeted positions. Two years ago they started going through Flint for them.
